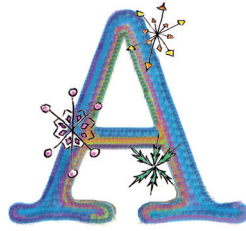


Micah's Glossary of Big and Little Words

Cat Astrophe

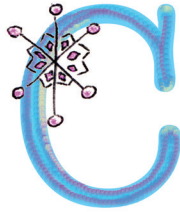
Catastrophe! A complete disaster! Run!
